

# Outreach Projects for Local Community (QS Sustainability Rankings – Social Impact Category)

Air University Islamabad is deeply committed to social responsibility and knowledge exchange through its outreach and community engagement initiatives. These projects span across education, health, information services, sports, and capacity-building, directly impacting local communities and aligning with the QS Sustainability Rankings' Social Impact indicators (KE1–KE4).

### 1. Educational and Information Outreach (KE1 & KE2)

Air University regularly hosts community workshops, awareness seminars, and capacity-building sessions that promote literacy, digital skills, and professional development. Faculty and students from programs such as Business, Health Management, and Engineering actively collaborate to deliver tutorials, mentorship sessions, and technical demonstrations to local schools and public groups. The university also organizes student-led seminars on entrepreneurship, technology, and innovation to encourage community learning and bridge knowledge gaps.

#### 2. Health Outreach and Awareness (KE2 & KE4)

Air University's Health Sciences and Public Health departments lead a variety of outreach projects in partnership with healthcare organizations. One recent example is the "Healthcare Speaks" event held on 29th May 2024, led by the BSHCM graduating students under the supervision of Ms. Novaira Ejaz. The event included interactive sessions on hospital policy, SOP implementation, ISO standards, and digital tools such as Power BI, and featured Mr. Saad Hussain from Islamabad Diagnostic Center (IDC) as the keynote speaker. This initiative not only trained students but also shared critical knowledge with the broader university community, contributing to improved healthcare awareness and professional preparedness.

### 3. Community Sports and Physical Development (KE2 & KE3)

Air University promotes community engagement through sports, fitness, and well-being initiatives. The Sports Department plays a crucial role in fostering physical development, teamwork, and mental health. Inter-departmental tournaments, open events, and the annual Student Week in March offer opportunities for inclusive participation and collaboration with local youth. These initiatives serve as platforms for building leadership, resilience, and community interaction—values integral to holistic education.

### 4. Sustainable Development and Environment-Focused Projects (KE1 & KE2)

In alignment with the SDGs and its sustainability vision, Air University supports student-led environmental projects that involve local community participation. Campaigns related to tree plantation, sustainable farming, and climate education not only raise awareness




but also engage volunteers in hands-on activities that benefit the local ecosystem and public health.





The need to cater to the children of single mothers was identified and the management of SOS decided to offer shelter and security to these children. Every child should grow up with love, care, and security. This project is known as SOS Children's Home.

Upon arrival at SOS Foundation, Kharian, we were warmly welcomed by the management team and staff. They briefed us about the history of the foundation, its mission, and the number



of children being cared for. A short tour of the premises was conducted, showcasing the dormitories, classrooms, playgrounds, and dining areas.

# 4. Interaction with Children

During the visit, we engaged with the children in various ways:

- Educational Activities: We conducted a small storytelling and interactive learning session.
- Recreational Activities: We played games, painted, and sang songs with the children.
- Motivational Talks: We encouraged them to pursue their dreams and assured them of support from society.

The children showed great enthusiasm and were eager to share their experiences.

# 5. Facilities and Living Conditions

The orphanage provides the following facilities:

- Accommodation: Well-maintained dormitories with proper bedding.
- Education: A dedicated school within the premises with qualified teachers.
- Healthcare: A small medical unit for basic health check-ups.
- Recreation: Playgrounds and activity rooms for sports and extracurricular activities.

Overall, the facilities were well-maintained, but there were areas that needed further improvement, such as expanding the library and enhancing computer learning opportunities.

#### 6. Donations and Contributions



Our team contributed the following items:

- School supplies (Colour books, Colour pencils).
- Food and hygiene products (Snacks, Chocolates).
- We also contributed PKR 37,000 for iftar arrangements ,spreading joy and warmth during the holy month.

The management expressed their gratitude and assured us that the donations would be utilized effectively.

# 7. Challenges Faced by the Orphanage

During discussions with the staff, some challenges were highlighted:

- Limited funding for expanding educational and vocational training.
- Need for better healthcare facilities.
- Shortage of volunteers for extracurricular activities.

These areas require community and organizational support to improve the quality of life for the children.

# 8. Conclusion and Recommendations

The visit to SOS Foundation, Kharian, was a heartwarming and insightful experience. The efforts of the management and staff in providing a safe and nurturing environment for the children are commendable. However, additional support in education, healthcare, and vocational training is needed.

# Recommendations:

- Encourage more volunteer participation in teaching and extracurricular activities.
- Arrange regular donation drives for essential items.



- Collaborate with NGOs and local businesses for funding and sponsorship.
- Set up skill development workshops for older children to prepare them for the future.





# **Blood Donation Drive at Air University Multan Campus (19-2-25)**


